PROTECTED LAND USE
Urban: Lands having existing densities greater than 2 units per acre or commercial use according to local zoning ordinance.
Agriculture: Lands for which primary use is agriculture (crops, livestock, orchards, vineyards, nurseries, and other farming activities), presently or in the immediate future.
Working: Lands that are managed for some degree of continuous high-quality timber or forestlands, natural resources, wildlife and fisheries and their related recreational values.
Reserve: Public or Private lands conserved or protected from conversion to urban and other uses through voluntary management plans in order to manage a geographic area, but which may require management intervention that degrades the quality of the regional conservation system in California (Section 14.3).

RESERVED LAND USE
Rural Residential: Lands with housing densities greater than 7 and up to 20 units/1/4 acre (1/4 acre = 10,890 square feet) and less than 1/4 acre area.
Special Residential: Lands with housing densities less than 7 units per 1/4 acre (1/4 acre = 10,890 square feet).

UNBUILT LAND USE
Public: Lands owned by local, state, or federal government, or other entities.
Private: Lands not publicly owned, including state-owned lands.

Urban & Reserve: 2010 State of California 2000 Census-based 2000 Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) Urban and Rural Land Use Data (2000) (USDA, 2000) and 2000 Land Use/Land Cover Data for all other areas.
Agriculture: CA Dept. of Fish and Game Wildlife Index for the Central Valley and 2010 USDA Land Use/Land Cover Data for all other areas.
Working: National Wetlands Inventory.
Reserve: USDA Forest Service (2000), Bureau of Land Management (2000), GAP Management Data (2000), CA Dept. of Parks and Recreation (2000).
Public/Private: State Data Center (covering 2007/2008) (2008) and CA Dept. of Public Information (covering 2000) (2000).
